The Karstendiek Tomb, Lafayette Cemetery No. 1

The Karstendeik tomb is a particular treasure because it is the only cast iron tomb in Lafayette Cemetery No. 1, and one of only 16 in all of Orleans Parish. The tomb is also popularly known as the "Vampire Lestat Tomb" because of its striking resemblance to the tomb prop featured in the film adaption of famed author Anne Rice's novel *Interview with the Vampire*.
